**Democracy**, or **democratic government**, is "a system of **government** in which all the people of a **state** or **polity** ... are involved in making decisions about its affairs, typically by voting to elect representatives to a parliament or similar assembly," as defined by the **Oxford English Dictionary**.<sup>[1]</sup> Democracy is further defined as (a) "government by the people; especially : rule of the majority (b:) " a government in which the supreme power is vested in the people and exercised by them directly or indirectly through a system of representation usually involving periodically held free elections."<sup>[2]</sup>

1. Comparison of school system

Greece

A school starts at age of 6 but, before this, a child might spend 2 or 3 years in kindergarten. School is compulsory until the age of 15. In primary schools in Greece, kids spend approximately 960 hours a year mean classes for 32 weeks. In secondary schools, students spend 1.100 hours in the classroom during a year. They have 98 days of vacation including 2 months during summer (July and August), 15 days during Christmas (from 24 to January 7) and another 15 days during Easter (not specified, it depends of the day of Easter).

Public schools are public (over 90%) but there are also private schools throughout Greece. The majority of students go to public school. Only a 6% of the total student population goes to a private school (2013). During 2014, 1.100.000 students in primary education, 360.000 in secondary education and 100.000 in tertiary education level. There are no schools related to church in Greece. The average number of students per class is 20.

The road towards today's democracy was long, there was much instability; 2 empires (with Napoleon III), 2 monarchies, 5 republics and the Vichy regime during WWII (with Marshal Pétain). It was in 1958 that General de Gaulle established the Fifth Republic. France's current regime based on the motto: 'Liberty, Equality, Fraternity'. (summary made by the Library of Congress website).


