WS 1

Vet4scape

Michael Huber-Kirchberger | 2 March, 15.45 - 17.00 and 3 March, 15.45 - 17.00

The VET4SCAPE project was a project for secondary vocational schools and had the ambition to improve the quality of this education. The project title «Vocational Education for Skills, Competence and Practice for the Economy» covered vocational training in skills, competencies and practice in the economy. There were 3 pillars on which the project VET4SCAPE is built:

- The major part was the creation of JA companies to gain practical experience with economic activities.
- The second aspect dealt with the strengthening of Business English competency.
- The third pillar supported students' intercultural competence and their ability to work in an international team.
